

Summary: Investigation of Alleged Reprisal at Lyndon B. Johnson National Historical Park

Report Date: October 6, 2016

OIG investigated allegations that a manager at Lyndon B. Johnson National Historical Park (LYJO) retaliated against an employee who reported fuel theft by another supervisor in April 2009. The employee further alleged a “hostile work environment” at the park. The employee asserted that reprisal first began in 2009 after he disclosed the fuel theft, and continued thereafter.

We did not substantiate the alleged reprisal action against the employee for reporting the fuel theft. We did find, however, that several employees characterized the workplace as “hostile,” “difficult,” or “my way or the highway.”

This is a summary of a report of investigation that was issued to the National Park Service for action.
