PURPOSE

The purposes of our review were (1) to determine the allowability of the costs claimed under the ARC grant, (2) to determine if the grant objectives were met, and (3) to determine the current status of the project.

SCOPE

Our review included procedures to review costs incurred and claimed for reimbursement under the grant. The period of performance for the grant was September 1, 1998, through August 31, 2000. We reviewed the grantee's reports, examined records, and held discussions with grantee officials in Bremen, Georgia on February 22, 2001. As a basis for determining allowable costs and compliance requirements, we used the provisions of the grant agreement, Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circulars A-87 and A-102, and the ARC Code. Audit work was performed in accordance with Government Auditing Standards.

BACKGROUND

ARC Grant GA-13076, Phase I and II, was awarded to Haralson County Commission in 1998. The grant was to provide funds to improve adult literacy and train local residents in GED preparation and entrepreneurial skills. Training will be provided through the construction of a computer lab that will utilize inter-active software and be staffed by adult literacy professionals from Carroll Technical Institute.

The proposed project costs for equipment and installation was estimated at \$365,914 as follows:

RESULTS

Financial Review

During our visit, we reviewed the grantee's accounting records, including invoices and supporting documentation for a sample of grant costs charged to the project. Total claimed costs were supported by the grantee's accounting records; and no deficiencies were noted as to the allowability of the expenses or the adequacy of the documentation for the expenditures we reviewed

The final costs claimed and accepted by ARC are as follows:

The grantee has met their required matching funds. Final reports were received on both phases and the grants were closed out September 23, 1999 and October 23, 2000, respectively. The Adult Literacy Program no longer requires federal support.

Program Review

The grantee has successfully completed the tasks of the grant with a computer lab established and a GED program in place with child care available, resulting in a higher than expected number of graduates receiving their GED in the second year. The grantee has also added an entrepreneurial program.
