Review of Appalachian Georgia Early Childhood Initiative

Grant No. GA-13551

PURPOSE

The purposes of our review were (1) to determine the allowability of the costs claimed under the ARC grant, (2) to determine if the grant objectives were met, and (3) to determine the current status of the project.

SCOPE

Our review included procedures to review costs incurred and claimed for reimbursement under the grant. The period of performance for the grant was October 1, 1999, through September 30 2001. We reviewed the grantee's reports, examined records, and held discussions with grantee officials in Atlanta, Georgia on February 26, 2001, we also visited the Haralson County site on February 22, 2001. As a basis for determining allowable costs and compliance requirements, we used the provisions of the grant agreement, Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circulars A-87 and A-102, and the ARC Code. Audit work was performed in accordance with Government Auditing Standards.

BACKGROUND

ARC Grant GA-13551 was awarded to the Georgia Children's Trust Fund Commission on September 24, 1999. The grant was to provide funds to support programs in five distressed and transitional counties in Appalachian Georgia, that will provide children there with the opportunities to achieve their optimal physical, educational, social and emotional development in the 0-3 age group and their families.

The proposed project costs was estimated at \$2,155,904. The ARC grant was for \$1,077,952 (50%). The grantee was to pay or cause to be paid the non-federal share of \$1,077,952 (50%).

RESULTS

Financial Review

During our visits we reviewed the grantee's accounting records, including invoices and supporting documentation for a sample of grant costs charged to the project. Total claimed costs were supported by the grantee's accounting records; and no deficiencies were noted as to the allowability of the expenses or the adequacy of the documentation for the expenditures we reviewed.

As of February 23, 2001, \$379,415 (35%) of the grant has been expensed, although only \$6,843 of ARC funds have been drawdown. The program experienced some delay in getting started due to planning complexities in some of the counties and the high degree of oversight required by the grantee. The grantee appears to be meeting their required matching funds.

Program Review

The Early Childhood Initiative is an in-depth program designed to attempt to meet all obstacles a family, and children in the 0-3 age group, may have that would prevent their success in achieving optimal development. The grantee has in place an intense monitoring and follow-up system. Progress reports have been received as required.
