<u>PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of our review was to determine if (a) the total funds claimed for reimbursement by the Hickory Flat Clinic for its Hickory Flat Clinic Health Care Project were expended in accordance with the ARC approved grant budget and did not violate any restrictions imposed by the terms and conditions of the grant; (b) the accounting, reporting and internal control systems provided for disclosure of pertinent financial and operating information; and (c) that the objectives of the grant are being met.

BACKGROUND: ARC awarded Grant Number MS-14007 to the Hickory Flat Clinic for the period July 1, 2001 through December 31, 2002. Amendment Number 1 to the Grant Agreement was approved July 3, 2002 by the ARC Contract Coordinator, extending the period of performance through December 31, 2002, and approving a budget revision concerning in-kind contribution sources. Total grant funding was for an amount not to exceed \$99,960 or 80 percent of actual, reasonable and eligible project costs. ARC required that the grant be matched with \$24,990 or 20 percent in cash, contributed services, or in-kind contributions, as approved by ARC. ARC made two progress/advance payments to Hickory Flat Clinic, in October 2001 and March 2002, totaling \$60,000.

The purpose of the grant is to provide funds to continue, enhance and expand health care services offered by Hickory Flat Clinic by replacing, upgrading, and adding medical and office equipment. The equipment will facilitate serving an increased number of patients and provide items needed by existing providers and any additional providers.

<u>SCOPE</u>: We performed a program review of the grant as described in the Purpose above. Our review was based on the terms of the grant agreement and on the application of

certain agreed-upon procedures previously discussed with the ARC, OIG. Specifically, we determined if the tasks described above were being performed, if the accountability over ARC funds is sufficient as required by applicable Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circulars, and if the Hickory Flat Clinic was in compliance with the requirements of the grant agreement. In addition, we discussed the program objectives and performance with the Hickory Flat Clinic personnel. Our results and recommendations are based on those procedures. These review procedures were performed in accordance with applicable Government Auditing Standards.

<u>RESULTS</u>: The following results are based on our review performed at the Hickory Flat Clinic in Hickory Flat, Mississippi from July 31, 2002 to August 1, 2002.

#### A. Incurred Costs

The Hickory Flat Clinic claimed total program costs of \$41,813 for the period July 1, 2001 through June 30, 2002 of which they claimed direct reimbursable cost of \$33,701 and matching costs of \$8,112. We reviewed the direct and matching costs claimed and determined that, in general, the funds had been expended as reported. However, we identified that \$26,299 in ARC funds drawn down in March 2002 that had not yet been expended as of June 30, 2002. This issue is discussed below.

## Draw Downs Exceeded Current Needs

The Hickory Flat Clinic drew down \$20,000 in October of 2001 and \$40,000 in March of 2002. The requests were for funding to cover periods from October 1, 2001 through October 31, 2001 and March 1, 2002 through May 31, 2002, respectively. During the course of our review, we noted that as of June 30, 2002 the Hickory Flat Clinic had expended \$33,701 of the ARC funds and had \$26,299 of ARC funds on hand.

Office of Management and Budget Circular A-110, Subpart C, Post-Award Requirements, Financial and Program Management, .22 Payment, paragraph (b) states:

"Recipients are to be paid in advance, provided they maintain or demonstrate the willingness to maintain: (1) written procedures that minimize the time elapsing between the transfer of funds and disbursement by the recipient, and (2) financial management systems that meet the standards for fund control and accountability as established in Section .21. Cash advances to a recipient organization shall be limited to the minimum amounts needed and be timed to be in accordance with the actual, immediate cash requirements of the recipient organization in carrying out the purpose of the approved program or project. The timing and amount of cash advances shall be as close as is administratively feasible to the actual disbursements by the recipient organization for direct program or project costs and the proportionate share of any allowable indirect costs."

According to the Hickory Flat Clinic Director, in order for the clinic to use ARC funding, the clinic must first contribute matching funds, at 20% of the expenditure. Matching funds from clinic resources had been lower than expected, so ARC funds were not used until matching funds could be acquired. In July of 2002, a revision to the matching portion of the budget for this grant was approved, allowing the use of a donated building to be allocated as a part of matching funds. The Clinic Director anticipated that the supplement of matching funds would allow the clinic to use the remaining ARC funds.

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

We recommend that the Hickory Flat Clinic not withdraw any of the remaining grant funds in excess of its current needs as required by OMB Circular A-110.

### **B.** Internal Controls

We did not identify any internal control weaknesses that could have affected the accountability of costs or compliance with the terms of the grant agreement.

## C. Program Results

Our review of the Hickory Flat Clinic Health Care Project indicated that the objectives of the grant had and are being met.

### OTHER:

We provided Hickory Flat Clinic with a copy of the draft review report on August 28, 2002. We did not receive any written or oral response to the finding or recommendation contained in the draft report. Therefore, no changes to the finding or recommendation have been made subsequent to the draft report.
