SUBJECT: Interim Survey Report of ARC Grants Awarded for Industrial Park Site Improvements--1987-1992

PURPOSE: The purpose of our survey was to determine the status of industrial park site improvement grants, with emphasis on the accomplishment of employment objectives.

BACKGROUND: ARC provided partial funding for the development of industrial parks in the Appalachian region. This funding was primarily for the development and construction of infrastructure such as access roads, site development, and water and sewer line improvements at existing or planned industrial sites. The ARC Office of Inspector General (OIG) has initiated a preliminary survey of industrial development grants awarded.

Basic agencies were responsible for project administration, including monitoring of infrastructure improvements and project accountability and reports. Consequently, this survey was limited to identifying the extent of development at the selected sites, including comparisons of estimated and actual development and employment creation or retention.

Funding for the 41 projects in our survey totaled \$38,005,970, including \$11,484,256 from ARC; \$6,586,050 from other Federal agencies; and \$19,935,664 from state and local governments.

The survey was performed by OIG and Tichenor and Associates, C.P.A. staff.

SCOPE AND SOURCE: The survey scope included most of the industrial site improvement projects for which ARC contributed funds between 1987 and 1992. The basis for our survey conclusions were the responses by grantees to a questionnaire and observations noted during field visits to sites in conjunction with other scheduled OIG reviews.

METHODOLOGY: Informational surveys were sent to 41 grantees requesting information about industrial park site improvements that had been funded, in part, by ARC grants. The surveys requested specific information on the following:

- o names of all business establishments currently occupying the site;
- o the approximate number of jobs created or retained as a result of the improvement project;
- o any projections on expected additional growth;

- o comments with respect to program or project strengths and weaknesses, successes, or problems.

Also, observation visits were made to 13 sites in Alabama, Georgia, Kentucky, Maryland, North Carolina, Tennessee, and West Virginia in order to visually identify and/or verify the extent of development. These observation visits, which were conducted in conjunction with other scheduled work in the geographic area, did not include testing at the industrial sites; but followup contact with grantees was initiated where required to clarify information or observations.

The results of the survey are included on Attachment A to this report. Attachment A does not contain the specific identity of companies in line with commitment noted in the survey questionnaire. Company identification is provided under separate cover for internal ARC use. We believe this approach contributed to the high degree of responses received.

Our site visits identified activity consistent with the survey responses received from grantees. Summarized employment issues and responses follow.

SUMMARY OF RESPONSES: We compared the 41 grantees' anticipated employment objectives, as stated in the grant applications, to the survey responses, which provided actual employment achievements, and drew the following broad conclusions.

- o 19 grantees reported exceeding their employment objectives. Of these, 15 grantees reported exceeding employment objectives between 200 and 500 percent.
- o 8 grantees generally obtained their employment objectives.
- o 12 grantees had not yet attained employment objectives, with 6 grantees noting attainment of 50 to 80 percent of goal. These grantees stated that they anticipate additional employment at the industrial site. In three cases, little or no development has resulted to date.
- o 6 grantees indicated less than 50 percent attainment of employment goals to date; and in three cases, there was little or no commercial development to date.
- o 1 grantee had not received the grant funding under their industrial site improvement grant.
- o 1 grantee did not accept the award from the ARC and, therefore, has no reportable employment statistics.

On an overall basis, it appeared that the program has been successful in assisting with local development, including the overall creation or retention of employment exceeding the cumulative estimates. The following examples denote examples where the estimated and expected development has not occurred to date.

No development has occurred at one Georgia site where ARC provided \$200,000 and other Federal agencies, \$490,000, for installation of water lines in 1988. A primary problem was the

noncompletion of a road bypassing the local town and providing better access to the industrial site. Efforts are continuing to obtain tenants, and our site visit indicated the site had been developed and was available for occupancy.

In this case, we also noted media publicity indicating that local officials were considering selling the site apparently to obtain reimbursement of the approximately \$214,000 local investment. We notified the cognizant Federal agency, and the grantee was informed about the applicable regulations with respect to sales and disposition of proceeds. As of February 1996, the grantee had employed a person with responsibilities for attracting industrial tenants.

At another site visited in Tennessee, little development had occurred although one of the companies that had committed to building at the site had done so but at a substantially reduced scale.

Conversely, our field visits also disclosed instances where development had exceeded estimates and other instances where continuing development and expansion was occurring and/or anticipated.

Our analysis of factors associated with the industrial development sites, such as proximity to interstate or major roads, railroads, or urban areas, did not provide a clear correlation as to reasons contributing to success, partial success, or failure in achieving development objectives. Comments by respondents indicated that changed conditions, such as economic turndowns in the early '90s or, as previously noted, unavailability of improved access, were the primary reasons for difficulties in attracting additional businesses.

On a related issue, our field observations at 13 sites visited disclosed no instances where ARC contributions were identified on a general sign or by separate identification. Industrial park identification signs were only noted at a few locations. In one case, Federal, state, or local funding was identified for several agencies; but ARC was not included on the list.

CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION: Based on our initial survey, we concluded that there was a high degree of project success in relation to project estimates. Followup testing will include grants made in 1993 and 1994 and, as applicable, additional contacts with less than successful sites noted in our survey to update the status of development efforts and potential for increased success.

In this connection, we recommend that ARC contact and work with grantees that have experienced difficulty to assist, if possible, in identifying potential strategies for improvement and/or alternative uses for the developed site. ARC should consider advising the management of successful industrial development parks of the need to publicly identify Federal, including ARC, participation.

Survey of Industrial Park Site Development

Attached is a copy of our survey report that indicates overall success with respect to achieving employment goals. We will continue to visit site locations in conjunction with other scheduled field work. We have also attached, for information only, summary sheets that denote the specific companies occupying the sites.

The survey is provided primarily for information purposes but includes a recommendation that ARC work, to the extent practical, with less successful developments to increase commercial development or identify alternative uses of the developed site. Also, in the absence of any noted identification of ARC participation at the 13 sites we visited, ARC should consider notifying successful developments of the need to acknowledge ARC assistance as long as acknowledgment was not prohibited as an eligible project cost under the basic Federal program through which ARC assistance was provided.
