#### I. INTRODUCTION

#### A. PURPOSE

The purposes of our review were (1) to determine the allowability of the costs claimed under the ARC grant, (2) to determine if the grant objectives were met, and (3) to determine the current status of the project.

#### B. SCOPE

Our survey included procedures to review costs incurred and claimed for reimbursement under the grant, as well as costs claimed as matching funds. The period of performance was December 1, 1995 through May 16, 1997. We reviewed the grantee's reports, examined records, and held discussions with grantee officials in Charleston, West Virginia, December 1-2, 1997. As a basis for determining allowable costs and compliance requirements, we used the provisions of the grant agreement, Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circulars A-87 and A-102, and the ARC Code.

#### C. BACKGROUND

ARC Grant WV-12301-96-I-302-1117 was awarded to assist in the enhancement and expansion of activities and services to better serve the export needs of small and medium-sized businesses and improve general economic conditions in the State of West Virginia. According to the grant agreement, the following tasks were to be completed:

1) Hire a staff person for the International Development Unit who will be responsible for both export and reverse investment activities, and who will

attend the NASDA Level 1 International Trade Specialist Training Program to enhance his/her knowledge of export and reverse investment strategy;

- 2) Identify and support three globally diverse trade events, plus the 1996 Europartenariat;
- 3) Develop multi-lingual promotional materials and catalogs of West Virginia businesses; acquisition and setup of a computer system, and participation in trade-related information delivery systems, such as Trade Point USA with the State of Ohio; and
- 4) Hold trade educational programs in conjunction with the West Virginia Export Council, to include, but not be limited to, informational seminars, business training workshops, and seminars on opportunities in specific markets.

The grant was for a total sum not to exceed \$133,300, which was estimated to be approximately 80 percent of project costs. The grantee was to pay or cause to be paid the non-federal share in cash, contributed services, or in-kind contributions, as approved by ARC. At the time of our review, the grantee had claimed and been paid \$115,248.63 based on total project expenditures of \$144,060.79. Grant funds totaling \$18,051.37 were deobligated and the grant was closed out at ARC in October 1997.

## II. SURVEY RESULTS

### A. Questioned Costs

The grantee claimed grant costs of \$115,248.63 (80 percent) and matching costs of \$28,812.16 (20 percent). We reviewed a sample of grant and matching expenditures and are questioning some meal costs associated with a grant-related business trip to Italy. A West Virginia delegation attended Europartenariat Italia in Genoa, Italy in November 1996. A "finale dinner" for four or five guests costing \$634.48 was charged to the ARC project. Guests included individuals from the state of West Virginia, a participating West Virginia company, the U. S. Embassy and the U.S. Department of Commerce - Milan, Italy. It was unclear whether the \$634.48 included dinner for a grantee representative (who subsequently left the grantee's employ) but we noted that he signed the charge slip and claimed \$47 for meals on his travel voucher for that day. The grantee provided documentation during our visit indicating that the allowance for meals and incidental expenses for Genoa, Italy were \$96 per day at that time. We are questioning the \$634.48, noted primarily as expenses for dinner guests, as being excessive and possibly duplicative of per diem reimbursements to attendees.

**Recommendation:** We recommend that the grantee resolve the questioned costs totaling \$634.48 with ARC program personnel and notify us of the outcome.

# B. Grantee Response

The grantee concurred with our recommendation.

# C. Grant Status

We determined that the tasks required of the grantee under the grant agreement were completed. The ARC project allowed the grantee to increase public awareness of its export initiatives, expand export promotion activities, and provide support and technical assistance to West Virginia businesses interested in exporting their products. Grant funds were also used to replace obsolete office equipment and hire an additional International Trade Representative.

The report on the Tennessee Customized Industrial Training Program questions the eligibility of large companies to participate in the project based on criteria included in the grant application. We are questioning approximately \$430,000 in ARC and matching costs; and this issue needs to be resolved, including the potential for some offsets attributable to the funding of other eligible training or state matching contributions. Also, the grantee noted an intention to request deobligation of the project balance of \$396,000. The report also recommends that future projects include identification of controls and procedures to be used to ensure the implementation of eligibility criteria included in grant applications or agreements.

The Pennsylvania Technical Assistance report notes improvements in the state's accounting system, which could facilitate closing of grants on a more expeditious basis. The report also cites the need for additional supporting information for some claimed costs and match and ARC's decision with respect to use of program income.

Conditions noted in the other reports are minor and generally were resolved prior to report issuance.
