

INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY | 24-097

Findings of Misconduct by a Federal Bureau of Prisons Warden for Inappropriate Sexual Relationship with a Subordinate Employee and Sexual Harassment of Another Subordinate Employee

The Department of Justice (DOJ) Office of the Inspector General (OIG) initiated this investigation upon the receipt of information from the Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP), Office of Internal Affairs (OIA), alleging that a then BOP Warden was involved in a sexual relationship with a subordinate BOP employee. During the course of the investigation, the OIG found indications that the Warden sexually harassed another subordinate employee.

The OIG investigation substantiated the allegations that the Warden had an inappropriate sexual relationship with a subordinate employee and that the Warden sexually harassed another subordinate employee, in violation of DOJ and BOP policy.

The Warden retired while the OIG's investigation was ongoing.

The OIG has completed its investigation and provided its report to the BOP for its information.



Unless otherwise noted, the OIG applies the preponderance of the evidence standard in determining whether DOJ personnel have committed misconduct.
