Investigative Summary: Time and Attendance Fraud

The U.S. Government Publishing Office (GPO), Office of the Inspector General (OIG), investigated an allegation of time and attendance fraud involving a GPO employee, including claims that the employee was ineligible for telework. The OIG found no evidence of false time reporting or unearned pay and did not substantiate the fraud allegation. Additionally, the employee had an approved telework agreement.

However, we found that the employee knowingly submitted inaccurate timecards, failing to account for telework days, days off, and actual hours worked. Additionally, the employee's managers approved these inaccuracies. Despite accounting errors, the employee still worked the required weekly hours.

This matter was not referred to the U.S. Attorney's Office for consideration. GPO OIG notified GPO leadership of this investigation and its results.
