<u>PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of our review was to determine if (a) the total funds claimed for reimbursement by the Kentucky Department for Local Government for its Water Resource Development Plan, Phase II were expended in accordance with the ARC approved grant budget and did not violate any restrictions imposed by the terms and conditions of the grant; (b) the accounting, reporting and internal control systems provided for disclosure of pertinent financial and operating information; and (c) the objectives of the grant had been met.

<u>BACKGROUND:</u> ARC awarded Grant Number KY-13352-99 to the Kentucky Department for Local Government for the period February 1, 1999 through June 30, 2000. The purpose of the grant was to provide funds to the Kentucky Department for Local Government for a comprehensive water resource plan for providing potable water to all Kentucky households by the year 2020.

The ARC grant funding was for \$300,000, or 28.5% of actual, reasonable and eligible project cost. The Grantee was to provide local matching funds totaling \$753,000, or 71.5%, in cash, contributed services or in-kind contributions.

The specific tasks were to:

- Retain consultants to conduct planning services based on analysis of GIS and other data.
- Review the characteristics of existing and potential water supply systems, assess geographic
 features that affect the placement and operation of treatment and distribution systems, and
 examine health risks and economic development concerns.

SCOPE: We performed a program review of the grant as described in the Purpose, above. Our review was based on the terms of the grant agreement and on the application of certain review procedures in accordance with the ARC, OIG Review Program. Specifically, we determined if the tasks listed above had been performed, if the accountability over ARC funds was sufficient as required by the applicable Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circulars, and if the Kentucky Department for Local Government had complied with the requirements of the grant agreement. In addition, we discussed the program objectives and performance with the Kentucky Department for Local Government's personnel. Our results and recommendations are based on those procedures and were conducted in accordance with applicable Government Auditing Standards.

<u>RESULTS</u>: The following results were based on our review performed at the Kentucky Department for Local Government in Frankfort, Kentucky on December 6, 2000 and December 7, 2000.

A. Incurred Costs

The Kentucky Department for Local Government incurred total program costs of \$1,088,908, of which they claimed direct reimbursable costs from February 1, 1999 through June 30, 2000 of \$300,000 from ARC. We reviewed the direct and in-kind costs incurred and determined that the funds had been expended as reported.

B. Internal Controls

We did not identify any internal control weaknesses that could have affected the accountability of costs or compliance with the terms of the grant agreement.

1. Ouarterly Project Progress Reports Were Not Submitted to the ARC

During the period of the grant, not all of the Quarterly Project Progress reports were not prepared and submitted to the ARC as required by the terms and conditions of the grant agreement. The grantee did submit two progress reports, one for the period ending December 31, 1999 and one for the period ending March 31, 2000.

OMB A-102, Subpart C, Section 41, para. (b)(3). Frequency, states:

"The Federal agency may prescribe the frequency of the report for each project or program. However, the report will not be required more frequently than quarterly. If the Federal agency does not specify the frequency of the report, it will be submitted annually. A final report will be required upon expiration or termination of grant support."

The grantee stated that the reports were submitted with the drawdown reports.

RECOMMENDATION:

We recommend that for future grants, the Kentucky Department for Local Government submit reports in accordance with grant agreement provisions.

C. Program Results

Our review of the Appalachian Kentucky Water Resource Planning Grant indicated that the objectives of the grant had been met.
