Attached is the report dealing with the review of compliance with ARC Grant Number KY-14118. The grant was initially awarded for work starting in October, 2001. Since then there have been 3 amendments extending the grant period through 2004. The funding was for a not to exceed amount of \$776, 994.

The review found an error in CITE's final SF-270, Request for Advance or Reimbursement, dated November 18, 2004 where actual costs incurred were under-reported by \$1,821,629. The recommendation was for ARC to require CITE to correct and resubmit a corrected SF-270.

Concurrent with this review, CITE ARC grants KY-14974 and KY-15056-05 were reviewed. ARC provided written comments to address the three reviews but did not address this recommendation.

This report will remain open and unresolved pending submission of the corrected SF-270

<u>PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of our review was to determine if (a) the total funds provided to CITE (formerly known as Center for Information Technology Enterprise, Inc.) for its Telecommunications Regional Initiative Project grant were expended in accordance with the ARC approved grant budget and did not violate any restrictions imposed by the terms and conditions of the grant; (b) the accounting, reporting, and internal control systems provided for disclosure of pertinent financial and operating information; and (c) that the objectives of the grant are being met.

BACKGROUND: ARC awarded Grant Number KY-14118 to CITE for the period October 1, 2001 through September 30, 2002. The ARC Project Coordinator approved Amendment Number 1 to the Grant Agreement on July 20, 2002 extending the period of performance through December 31, 2002. Total ARC funding for this period was for an amount not to exceed \$249,994 or approximately 58.4% of actual, reasonable, and eligible project costs. ARC required that the grant be matched with \$178,000 or 41.6% in cash, contributed services, and in-kind contributions, as approved by the ARC. Tichenor & Associates, LLP previously reviewed this period in a report dated February 6, 2003 (OIG Report 03-06).

The ARC approved Amendment Number 2 to the Grant Agreement on September 30, 2002 extending the period of performance to December 31, 2003. This amendment also increased total ARC funding of the project to a sum not to exceed \$499,994 or approximately 39% of actual reasonable and eligible project costs. ARC required that the

grant be matched with \$782,000 or 61% in cash, contributed service, and in-kind contributions, as approved by the ARC.

The ARC approved Amendment Number 3 to the Grant Agreement on September 12, 2003 extending the period of performance to December 31, 2004. This amendment also increased total ARC funding of the project to a sum not to exceed \$776,994 or approximately 37.3% of actual reasonable and eligible project costs. ARC required that the grant be matched with \$1,306,000 or 62.7% in cash, contributed service, and in-kind contributions, as approved by the ARC.

The purpose of the grant was to provide an initial assessment in Appalachian Kentucky, to determine who uses the internet and for what purposes, how the internet performs and identify access problems. As a result of this project the State of Kentucky will be able to develop better deployment plans for broadband service. All sectors of the local economies will benefit from the results of the project as it relates to expansion of telecommunications services.

SCOPE: We performed a program review of the grant as described in the Purpose above. Our review was based on the terms of the grant agreement and on the application of certain agreed-upon procedures previously discussed with the ARC OIG. Specifically, we determined if the tasks described above were being performed, if the accountability over ARC funds is sufficient as required by applicable Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circulars, and if CITE was in compliance with the requirements of the grant agreement. In addition, we discussed the program objectives and performance with CITE personnel. Our results and recommendations are based upon those procedures. These review procedures were performed in accordance with applicable Government Auditing Standards.

<u>RESULTS</u>: The following results are based on our review performed at CITE in Bowling Green, Kentucky, on March 5, 2007 through March 16, 2007.

#### A. Incurred Costs

CITE's financial records report total program costs of \$3,643,258 for the grant period. Of these costs, \$776,994 (21.3%) was attributed to ARC expenditures, with the remaining \$2,866,264 (78.7%) attributed to matching and in-kind expenditures. See Appendix A for a Schedule of Costs Budgeted and Incurred.

During the course of the audit, we reviewed the direct, indirect, and in-kind costs claimed and determined that the funds had been expended as shown in the financial records.

#### **B.** Internal Controls

During the course of the audit, we reviewed CITE's system of internal controls. One area of weakness was identified that could have affected the accountability of costs or compliance with the terms of the grant agreement.

## 1. Under-reporting of Actual Costs Incurred

During the course of the audit, we noted that CITE's final SF-270, Request for Advance or Reimbursement, dated November 18, 2004, under-reported actual costs incurred by \$1,821,629:

CITE management stated that because the grant was for Appalachian Kentucky, but the program was expanded to be a statewide project, they only included 50% of total program outlays in their reporting.

#### Recommendation:

We recommend that ARC require CITE to correct and resubmit its final SF-270, Request for Advance or Reimbursement.

## ARC's Response:

Concurrent with our review of KY-14118, we also reviewed CITE's ARC grants KY-14974 and KY-15056-05 (see OIG Report Numbers 08-12 and 08-13, respectively). ARC provided a written response to those two draft reports but did not comment on this recommendation.

#### Auditor's Comment:

ARC has not commented on the recommendation. As a result, we continue to make this recommendation.

#### C. Program Results

Our review of CITE's Telecommunications Regional Initiative Project grant indicated that the specific objectives identified in the grant were achieved.
