The purpose of this letter is to comply with Section 7 (9) of Public Law 110-409 [H.R. 928] of the Inspector General Reform Act of 2008, with an annual report to Congress and the President by December 31, 2010.

The IG Reform Act of 2008 incorporated changes that required the Integrity Committee (IC), in conjunction requiring the Council Chairperson, to address transparency and reporting issues for the IC. As part of the transparency and reporting requirements, the IC submits the following information for fiscal year 2010.

- The number of allegations received. (44)
- The number of allegations referred to other agencies, including the number of allegations referred for criminal investigation. (1)
- The number of allegations referred to the Chairperson of the Integrity Committee for investigation. (1)
- The number of allegations closed without referral. (10)
- The number of allegations closed but referred to the IG. (26)
- The opening and closing dates for each allegation. (see chart)
- In the case of allegations referred to the Chairperson of the Integrity Committee, a summary of the status of the investigation of the allegations and, in the case of an investigation completed during the proceeding fiscal year, a summary of the findings of the investigation. (see enclosure)
- Other matters that the Council considers appropriate. (none)

Summary of allegations referred to the Chairperson of the Integrity Committee (IC):

IC 611: In April 2009, A. Roy Lavik, Inspector General (IG) for the Commodity Futures Trading Commission (CFTC) self-reported a complaint received against him regarding the alleged improper influence in the course of the procurement action to select an accounting firm to conduct the Financial Statement Audits (FSAs). The IC assigned the Office of Inspector General (OIG) for the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) to conduct the administrative investigation. In June 2010, the OIG-EEOC provided the Report of Investigation to the IC which determined that there was insufficient evidence to support the allegation that the IG, CFTC, exerted improper influence in connection with FSA. The IC accepted and adopted the findings and conclusion of the EEOC IG report. This matter was reported to Congressional committees with jurisdiction by letter dated July 15, 2010.

IC640: In June 2010, the IC asked the assistance of the Office of Inspector General for the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration, Department of Treasury, to lead an administrative investigation into the alleged abuse of authority by the Inspector General (IG), Assistant IG for Investigations, Deputy Assistant IG for Investigations and a former Deputy Assistant IG for Investigations of the US Postal Service. This administrative investigation is pending. The IC will submit a summary report to the Congressional committees with jurisdiction when the administrative investigation is completed.
