Dear Ms. Young:

Pursuant to the *Government Charge Card Abuse Prevention Act of 2012* (Pub. L. No. 112-194), Inspectors General must report to the Director of OMB the agency's progress in implementing Government charge card audit recommendations.

We issued a purchase card audit report in May 2022.¹ As of January 25, 2023, the National Science Foundation (NSF) has 2 open purchase card audit recommendations that we are monitoring. The agency expects to complete action on them by February 15, 2023, and March 31, 2023, respectively. We are not submitting a semiannual Joint Purchase Card Violation Report because NSF's FY 2022 purchase card activity was less than \$10 million.

As of September 30, 2022, there were no outstanding NSF travel card audit recommendations. We issued our last travel card audit report in August 2015. Travel card activity for FY 2022 was also less than \$10 million.
