SUBJECT

Survey Report of ARC Grants Awarded for Infrastructure Projects (Industrial Site, Sewer, and Water Grants that Included Job Creation

Objectives)--1987-1993

<u>PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of our survey was to determine the status of the sampled grants, with emphasis on the accomplishment of employment objectives.

RESULTS: Based on responses from all 105 grantees surveyed and 22 field observations by OIG staff, we concluded that grant related job creation objectives were achieved to a very high degree. Information about completed projects indicated that approximately twice as many jobs (30,000) were created than were noted in job estimates included with grant applications with about 65 percent of grantees noting job creation substantially in excess of estimates and less than 10 percent reporting limited job creation to date.

BACKGROUND: ARC provided partial funding for the development of industrial parks and sewer and water systems where the grant objectives included creation and retention of jobs. This funding was primarily for the development and construction of infrastructure such as access roads, site development, and water and sewer line improvements at existing or planned industrial sites. The ARC Office of Inspector General (OIG) previously issued a survey of 41 industrial site development grants awarded between 1987 and 1992. This survey supplements the initial survey and included contacts with an additional 105 grantees for whom approvals were made between 1989 and 1993.

Basic agencies were responsible for project administration, including monitoring of infrastructure improvements and project accountability and reports. Consequently, this survey was limited to identifying the extent of development at the selected sites, including comparisons of estimated and actual development and employment creation.

Funding for the 105 projects in our survey totaled \$155,432,139, including \$30,317,451 from ARC.

SCOPE AND SOURCE: The survey scope included 105 industrial site improvement projects for which ARC contributed funds between 1987 and 1993. The basis for our survey conclusions were the responses by grantees to a questionnaire and observations noted during field visits to sites in conjunction with other scheduled OIG reviews.

<u>METHODOLOGY</u>: Informational surveys (Attachment A) were sent to the 105 grantees requesting information about industrial park site improvements that had been funded, in part, by ARC grants. The surveys requested specific information on the following:

- names of all business establishments currently occupying the site;
- the approximate number of jobs created as a result of the improvement project;
- any projections on expected additional growth;
- comments with respect to program or project strengths and weaknesses, successes, or problems.

Also, observation visits were made to 22 sites in Alabama, Maryland, New York, North Carolina, Tennessee, and Virginia in order to visually identify and photograph the extent of development. These observation visits, which were conducted in conjunction with other scheduled work in the geographic area, did not include attesting to the exact number of employees at the industrial sites; but followup contact with grantees was initiated where required to clarify information or observations that were inconsistent with survey responses. Our site visits generally identified activity consistent with the survey responses received from grantees.

The results of the survey are included on Attachment B to this report. Attachment B does not contain the specific identity of companies in line with the commitment noted in the survey questionnaire. We believe this approach contributed to the high degree of responses received.

Summarized employment issues and responses follow.

SUMMARY: We compared the grantees' anticipated employment objectives, as stated in the grant applications to the 105 survey responses, which identified employment achievements, and drew the following broad conclusions. In several instances, it was difficult to identify whether responses about job creation referred to the number of jobs created since the initial establishment of the business or the number of additional jobs that were created as a result of the infrastructure project. In those instances, we generally used conservative numbers that could result in an understatement of accomplishments although the few instances noted would not offset the overall positive accomplishments reported.

For the 90 responses where data was provided in grant applications with respect to job creation estimates and compared with reported results for completed projects, 40 responses noted exceeding employment objectives by over 200 percent and 19 responses noted exceeding employment objectives between 100 and 200 percent. (15 additional responses generally indicated the extent of job creation but did not include estimated job creations in the grant application.)

- New employment objectives were noted as met in 2 cases, 12 grantees reported achieving 50 to 100 percent of objectives, and 8 responses indicated accomplishment of 20 to 50 percent of employment objectives.
- In 4 cases, the grantees reported little or no job creation to date; and in 3 cases, achievement of less than 20 percent of job creation goals were noted. In these cases, the grantees indicated that development efforts were continuing and positive results were expected in most cases. We will followup to ascertain the status of these projects.
- In 4 instances, project completion had been delayed by various factors, including late starts, litigation about faulty construction, and bad weather. In each case, the grantee indicated that a successful outcome would be achieved when the project was completed. We will followup to ascertain the status of these projects.
- In 62 instances, responses noted that additional job creation was expected within the next 2 years. An analysis of the information provided indicated that the applicants had estimated creation of about 15,000 jobs when submitting grant requests and that about 30,000 jobs had been created in the project areas since grant approval. Based on project funding, the cost per estimated job noted in grant applications was approximately \$10,000, of which the ARC portion was about \$2,000 per job; and the cost of each reported job creation was about \$5,000, including an ARC portion of \$1,000 per job.

Despite some inconsistencies with the reported data, e.g., job creation estimates were not included with some applications and it was difficult in some cases to determine if reported job creations occurred after project approval or referred to jobs created prior to project approval, we believe the summary information reflects an accurate representation of the overall project results. Generally, we used conservative estimates and concluded that the program and related grants had been very successful in assisting with local development, including the overall creation or retention of employment exceeding the cumulative estimates.

As noted above, Attachment B reflects that 90 percent of the 105 grant applications provided estimates of potential job creation of about 14,000 jobs. The responses from all 105 grantees included in the survey reflect creation of over 30,000 jobs since grant approval. If the jobs reported as created by the 15 grantees not providing specific job creation estimates at the time of grant approval were excluded from the overall total, the resulting job creation would exceed 26,000. Under either extrapolation, the project results would approximately double the initial estimates. Also, we believe that, based on the high percentage of input indicating job creation substantially in excess of estimates, the higher number of reported job creation is more reflective of overall results.

With respect to project results, we did not request information about the extent of job retention resulting from the projects. However, information supplied by some grantees identified substantial job retention, which we concluded indicated that job retention was an important project result.

Grantee comments, where provided, unanimously cited the importance of the ARC project approval and funding as critical for development in the applicable location; and in many cases, the questionnaire was annotated to identify the number of jobs that were retained because of project implementation. For example, in one case, a grantee, while noting creation of 199 new jobs, also noted an overall net loss of 226 jobs from 12 businesses between 1993 and 1997 but a retention of 2,393 jobs that would have been lost without the project.

Grantees also noted, especially with respect to sewer and water projects, that these projects, in addition to assisting with commercial economic development, were essential for residential development and improvement, including assistance to poverty population areas.

On a related issue, our field observations at the sites visited disclosed no instances where ARC contributions were identified on a general or by separate identification. Industrial park identification signs were only noted at a few locations. A similar condition was noted in our prior survey report.

CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION: Based on our initial survey, we concluded that there was a high degree of project success in relation to project estimates. Followup testing will include grants made in 1994 and, as applicable, additional contacts with projects noted as having limited success in order to update the status of development efforts and potential for increased success.

In this connection, we recommend that ARC contact and work with grantees that have experienced difficulty to assist, if possible, in identifying potential strategies for improvement and/or alternative uses for the developed site. ARC should determine if public identification of ARC participation in infrastructure projects is appropriate and, if applicable, notify grantees of any requirements.

The final report contains essentially the same information as noted in the interim report issued January 22, 1998. The final report includes responses dealing with five grants that had not been received as of January 22, 1998, and corrects a few of the summary totals noted in the interim report.

As noted in the interim report, the survey indicated job creation reported by grantees substantially exceeded the extent of job creation noted in grant applications. Our field observations in connection with 22 of 105 grants confirmed the extent of reported business development, and we have no reason to believe the information provided for the other 83 grantees in the survey does not represent the status of the projects and results to date.

Our primary recommendation is for ARC followup on the projects that were reported as not completed in order to determine project status and/or lend assistance, if possible, to ensure completion and results.
