SUBJECT: Failed Bank Review of Independent National Bank

This memorandum presents the results of our review of the failure of Independent National Bank (Independent). Independent opened in October 1988 and had a main office in Ocala, Florida, and three branches located in central Florida. The bank was a subsidiary of Independent Bancshares, Inc., a bank holding company located in Ocala, Florida. The Office of the Comptroller of the Currency (OCC) closed Independent and appointed the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) as receiver on August 20, 2010. As of June 30, 2010, the bank had \$156.2 million in total assets. FDIC estimated that the loss to the Deposit Insurance Fund is \$23.2 million.

Because the loss to the Deposit Insurance Fund is less than \$200 million, as set forth by section 38(k) of the Federal Deposit Insurance Act (FDIA), we conducted a review of the failure of Independent that was limited to (1) ascertaining the grounds identified by OCC for appointing the FDIC as receiver and (2) determining whether any unusual circumstances exist that might warrant a more in-depth review of the loss. In performing our review we (1) examined documentation related to the appointment of FDIC as receiver and (2) interviewed OCC personnel.

We conducted this performance audit during August and September 2010 in accordance with generally accepted government auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain sufficient, appropriate evidence to provide a reasonable basis for our findings and conclusions based on our audit objectives. We believe that the evidence obtained provides a reasonable basis for our findings and conclusions based on our audit objectives.

Causes of Independent's Failure

The primary cause of Independent's failure was the pursuit of growth without the development of adequate risk management and credit administration practices. For example, Independent's credit culture was such that lending decisions were based more on personal relationships than the borrowers' demonstrated ability to repay. In addition, the processes for the on-going monitoring and analysis of a borrower's financial condition and collateral were deficient, as was the problem loan identification process. These weaknesses resulted in a portfolio of poorly underwritten and managed loans significantly concentrated in Florida commercial real estate. When confronted with a downturn in the commercial real estate market, Independent suffered diminished earnings and capital and, ultimately, failure.

Conclusion

Based on our review of the causes of Independent's failure and the grounds identified by OCC for appointing FDIC as receiver, we determined that there were no unusual circumstances surrounding the bank's failure or the supervision exercised by OCC. Accordingly, we have determined that a more in-depth review of the bank's failure by our office is not warranted.

We provided a draft of this memorandum to OCC management for comment. In its response, OCC stated that it agreed with our conclusion as to the causes of Independent's failure and that it had no concerns with our determination that an indepth review of the bank's failure was not warranted. You concluded that the primary cause of Independent's failure was the pursuit of growth without the development of adequate risk management and credit administration practices. We agree.

You determined that there were no unusual circumstances surrounding the bank's failure or the supervision exercised by OCC. As a result, you determined that a more in-depth review of the bank's failure by the OIG is not warranted. We have no concerns with your determination.
